"YES there IS a local issue that bothers me - Respect My SeX if you want my X!"

Can you tell me what a woman is?

What do you think is most important? Sex or gender?

- Sex is a protected characteristic in the Equality Act.
- But some local authorities have begun prioritising self-declared 'gender' over sex.
- This filters down into Council policies such as the provision of public toilets and the management of sensitive services such as rape crisis and domestic violence shelters. It also impacts data collection, statistical analysis, and outcome monitoring such as gender pay-gap data.
- Do you believe that Councils should undermine science and established language in this way?

If elected, would you work to ensure that our local authority retains the concept of sex in language, communications, policy development, and practice, in line with the Equality Act?

Local authorities have begun removing women's single sex spaces and replacing them with mixed sex ones. Do you support this?

- For example, Arun Council is spending £250k replacing Bognor Regis's public single sex toilets with 'gender neutral' ones. Do you support that?
- If you are elected will you ensure that women's single sex spaces are protected in all Council-run facilities such as parks and playgrounds and swimming pools?
- Will you also ensure that the council uses building regulations and planning decisions to require large private businesses and buildings to maintain single sex toilets and changing areas?

If elected, would you work to ensure that our local authority protects and promotes women's single sex spaces and services, both in direct provision, and where you have regulatory / partnership influence?

Local authorities have been undermining safeguarding as it impacts children, but also women and vulnerable adults.

- Some Councils have spent thousands of pounds on training for schools that introduces children to the idea that they might be born in the wrong body. Oxfordshire County Council had to remove its training after a court challenge.
- They have allowed adult material such as "drag queen story time" to be presented to children in public libraries? How does this benefit our kids?
- Safeguarding also matters in service provision to vulnerable adults. For example, the elderly have the right to choose same sex carers and other service providers.

If elected, would you work to ensure that our local authority prioritises the safeguarding the vulnerable in the provision of all services where sex matters?
